## Applying to the DCED Consultants Marketplace

- Worked or consulted on results measurement in a substantial role for a programme using the DCED Standard, which has taken an audit or pre-audit review.
- Preferably undertaken formal training in the DCED Standard.

In order to apply, please send your CV to <u>Admin@Enterprise-Development.org</u>, detailing your experience with the DCED Standard, and your availability for consulting assignments. We may follow up references from previous clients, and administer a short assessment before approving your entry onto the marketplace. We are unable to give feedback on references and assessments.

Before applying, please note that:

- Being on the marketplace is not an endorsement or recommendation from the DCED, and should not be represented as such.
- Once on the marketplace, we ask you to stay in touch and let us know of any upcoming assignments you are undertaking using the DCED Standard. This helps us monitor demand for the Standard, and the need for additional support. We also aim to support the sharing of knowledge and experience between members of the marketplace.
- Being on the marketplace is the first step towards becoming an accredited auditor of the DCED Standard. Auditors must have substantial experience with the DCED Standard in multiple countries, and need to conduct two full audits with an existing qualified auditor. If you are interested in this, please let us know.
