## Social-Ecological Transformation of the Economy as Guiding Principle

- A fundamental social-ecological transformation of economic and financial systems is required to enable sustainable development in the future
- Social-ecological transformation = economic and financial <u>systems</u> that are socially just, ecologically sustainable, digital, resilient and competitive. Previously disadvantaged population groups should benefit from the changes.
- Traditional economic development cooperation is reaching its limits we need to support the transformation through structural policy
- Focus on **policy measures** that shape the economic, financial and trade framework
  - More projects at the macro-level to effect systemic changes
  - Strong cooperation with like-minded international and multilateral partners
  - Three thematic areas: 1) sustainable transformation of economic and financial systems, 2) private sector mobilization and 3) women's economic empowerment

### Multilateral Cooperation to address Cross-border Issues

German Development Minister **Svenja Schulze**: *"The great challenges of our time can only be met if the world joins together in solidarity."* 

- New BMZ <u>multilateral strategy</u>; focus on
  - provision of global public goods (peace, climate, environment and health),
  - establishing social-ecological economic and financial as well as social protection systems,
  - making societies socially just, ecologically sustainable, resilient, safer and overall, more liveable.
- Strengthening cooperation with like-minded partners who share the same key values.



# Example: Private Sector Development and Economic Policy Advice for Green Industrialization in Uzbekistan (Link)

Commissioned by BMZ, 9 Mio EUR, 12/2022 – 12/2025

Key challenges:

- Sustainable industrialization and green transition lag behind country's own expectations
- Outdated and inefficient technologies used in manufacturing sector → low energy efficiency and competitiveness of the industry
- Share of manufacturing sector in GDP and share of manufacturing employment in total employment stagnates
- Objective: Energy- and resource-efficient production in Uzbekistan is driving the country's green industrialization and creating the conditions for long-term environmentally aware economic growth

### Approach:

- Economic policy advice and human and operational capacity building of public sector actors for industrial policy
- Technical capacity building in private sector for implementation of sustainable production methods
- Demand-oriented services for green future-oriented industries (textiles and construction materials)

## **Regional and Bilateral Projects with GIP Focus**

#### Investment Climate Reform (ICR) Facility



"To improve the business and investment climate in ACP countries, especially with regard to women's economic participation."

- Demand-based short-term TA for business environment and investment climate improvement initiatives
- Policy reforms, public-private dialogues and financial systems development
- Expertise to national and subregional **development finance institutions**

#### <u>Green Economy in Serb</u>



*"To utilize the potential of a green economic transformation so that Serbian MSMEs can compete on international markets."* 

- Policy advice to contribute to political strategies and processes, e.g. as part of the implementation of national industrial policies
- Support to business organisations in aligning services with needs of MSMEs,
  e.g. for women-led businesses or in the area of environmental protection
- Communication of project work to public to raise awareness of the green transition among Serbian companies, political actors and the population

#### Green Action in Enterprises in Jordan (GAIN)



*"To introduce an improved framework for environmentally friendly and resource-conserving production in the private sector"* 

- Policy support for instruments to foster transformation of the industrial sector
- Facilitate green investments in industrial companies and support of industrial ecosystem
- WEE: gender-mainstreaming approaches adapted to the industrial context

#### Vlacroeconomic Reform / Green Growth in Vietnar



*"To improve the management of public and private resources for an inclusive and green growth"* 

- Support to Vietnamese government in development and implementation of macroeconomic reforms for environmentally and socially sustainable growth
- TA, capacity building and training to enable key government stakeholders to implement reforms independently and sustainably
- Development of national indicators for monitoring environmentally sustainable economic development
