13:00 – 14:00	An introduction to the DCED Standard for Results Measurement <ul style="list-style-type: none">- This session will introduce the DCED Standard for results measurement which provides a framework for guiding credible monitoring and reporting of results. Around 150 projects in 50 countries are currently using the Standard in different themes in private sector development, ranging from value chain development, to challenge funds, to business environment reform. It remains one of the products for which the DCED is best known in the PSD community.
14:00 – 15:00	Measuring systems change <ul style="list-style-type: none">- This will be an interactive discussion led by Netherlands Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MOFA) and the Netherlands Enterprise Agency (RVO) on how to measure systems change at an agency level. MOFA and RVO will introduce the PADEO (Programmatic Approach Sustainable Economic Development) approach through which the Dutch government is applying a systems change approach to contribute to long term, sustainable impact. They will explain how they are aiming to capture systems change as a result of the PADEO approach and challenges faced in aggregating results. The example is provided to trigger a broader discussion on how to assess, report and communicate about systems change and share learnings and good practice within the community.

15:30 – 16:30	Measuring job quality <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Over the last six months, the International Labour Organization (ILO) Systems Change Initiative carried out a series of talks with eight DCED member agencies to unpack questions on how to define and subsequently measure job quality. ILO will present the findings of these sessions and share a new tool to measure the effect of digital labour platforms on job quality. The objective of the session will be to initiate further dialogue on how to improve the measurement of job quality and identify learning products or sessions that can help donors and agencies in this.
