

# Results Measurement Best Practices according to the DCED Standard

# One-day Workshop 30<sup>th</sup> September 2024 Nairobi, Kenya

This workshop precedes the Donor Committee for Enterprise Development (DCED) Global Seminar that will be held at the Nairobi Serena Hotel, Kenya on 1-3 October 2024.

The workshop, at the same hotel, targets participants of the DCED Seminar and others who would like to explore best practices in Results Measurement according to the DCED Standard.

# Why the DCED Standard?

The <u>Donor Committee for Enterprise Development</u> (DCED) <u>Standard for Results Measurement in Private Sector Development</u> provides programs with a framework to monitor their results in a systematic way.

This empowers development assistance programs to learn and adapt based on the monitoring data which they collect, and to measure and report results with a reasonable degree of rigour.

Over 150 programs in more than 50 countries are currently using the DCED Standard, in sectors ranging from market systems development to challenge funds to business environment reform.

# Who should attend?

The workshop is appropriate for professionals in private sector development (PSD) interested in gaining a practical overview of the best practices in Results Measurement according to the DCED standard.

- Managers and staff from programs and organisations involved in PSD
- Donor personnel with responsibility for PSD
- Results measurement managers and specialists
- Consultants advising PSD programs
- Private Sector professionals cooperating with development assistance organisations

### What will I learn?

This workshop offers a practical overview of Results Measurement best practices according to the DCED Standard. It not only covers the fundamentals of good results measurement with examples of their application, but also enables you to experience applying key aspects to actual case programs.

You will also learn about the experiences of other institutions using results measurement to drive adaptive management and have plenty of opportunities to ask questions about the benefits and challenges of applying the Standard in practice.

By the end of the workshop, you will be able to:

- Describe why an effective results measurement system is essential for managing systemic programs and operationalising adaptive management.
- Identify key elements of good practice in monitoring and measuring results, including developing results chains, indicators and monitoring plans, assessing attribution and using information for management.
- Define the key steps and processes to develop an appropriate results measurement system for your institution or program.
- Describe key lessons in applying the DCED Standard in practice.
- Locate additional information and support on results measurement best practices and the DCED Standard.
